## A BILL

To direct the Secretary of State to host regular Summits of the Americas, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

**3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Summit of the Amer-5 icas Act".

6 SEC. 2. SUMMIT OF THE AMERICAS AND RELATED MAT-7 TERS.

8 (a) STATEMENT OF POLICY.—It shall be the policy
9 of the United States to work with the Summit of the
10 Americas Secretariat to support the organization of a

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Summit of the Americas every four years, or more fre quently as appropriate, subject to the availability of funds,
 to strengthen ties and promote cooperation between the
 United States and countries in the Western Hemisphere,
 as well as civil society, business, diaspora, women, and
 youth leaders.

7 (b) AUTHORIZATION.—The Secretary of State is au8 thorized to carry out the policy described in subsection (a).
9 (c) CITIES SUMMIT OF THE AMERICAS.—

10 (1) FINDINGS.—Congress finds the following:

(A) Subnational diplomacy strengthens
democratic governance by enhancing local leaders' ability to tackle shared challenges, and
deepens United States ties with regional partners by localizing bilateral and multilateral
partnerships and connections.

(B) The first-ever Cities Summit of the
Americas in 2023 promoted a valuable exchange of best practices and lessons learned between city, State, municipal, and regional leaders and should be held as part of the Summit
of the Americas process.

(2) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State is
authorized to work with the Summit of the Americas
Secretariat to support the organization of one Cities

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1 Summit of the Americas, across cities in the West-2 ern Hemisphere, including the United States, to 3 take place as a part of each Summit of the Americas 4 described in subsection (a), to promote subnational 5 cooperation and serve as a catalyst in fostering en-6 gagement with representatives of government, civil 7 society, business, academia, youth, culture and the 8 arts, Latin American and Caribbean diaspora com-9 munities, and underrepresented groups. 10 (d) SUMMIT OF THE AMERICAS IMPLEMENTATION 11 UNIT.— 12 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of State is authorized to establish within the Department of 13 14 State a Summit of the Americas implementation 15 unit responsible for overseeing the implementation of 16 commitments made at summits described in this sec-

17 tion.

18 (2) DUTIES.—The duties of the implementation
19 unit authorized by this subsection include—

20 (A) tracking and ensuring implementation
21 of commitments made during Summits of the
22 Americas;

(B) liaising with interagency partners and
the National Security Council regarding implementation of summit commitments; and

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(C) reporting quarterly on a public website
 of the Department of State regarding progress
 to accomplish summit commitments and status
 of commitments across Federal departments
 and agencies.

6 (e) REPORT.—Not later than one year after the date 7 of the enactment of this Act, and annually thereafter for 5 years, the Secretary of State shall submit to the Com-8 9 mittee on Foreign Relations of the Senate and the Com-10 mittee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives 11 a report on the implementation of this section, including 12 the status of commitments of the United States and par-13 ticipating partners for the prior year and upcoming year.
